

# KINGDOM HARVEST

We are now in the final quarter of the year which means there are only several months left. This time of year is referred to as the Fall season. It is the time of year when the seeds that were sown during the spring, produce the harvest.

Jesus often used parables for illustration. One such parable is found in Mark 4:3-8 and is known as the parable of the sower and reads: <sup>3</sup>Listen! A farmer went out to sow his seed. <sup>4</sup>As he was scattering the seed, some fell along the path, and the birds came and ate it up. <sup>5</sup>Some fell on rocky places, where it did not have much soil. It sprang up quickly, because the soil was shallow. <sup>6</sup>But when the sun came up, the plants were scorched, and they withered because they had no root. <sup>7</sup>Other seed fell among thorns, which grew up and choked the plants, so that they did not bear grain. <sup>8</sup>Still other seed fell on good soil. It came up, grew and produced a crop, some multiplying thirty, some sixty, some a hundred times.” (NIV)

Jesus later explains the parable in verses 14-20: <sup>14</sup>The sower sows the word. <sup>15</sup>And these are the ones by the wayside where the word is sown. When they hear, Satan comes immediately and takes away the word that was sown in their hearts. <sup>16</sup>These likewise are the ones sown on stony ground who, when they hear the word, immediately receive it with gladness; <sup>17</sup>and they have no root in themselves, and so endure only for a time. Afterward, when tribulation or persecution arises for the word’s sake, immediately they stumble. <sup>18</sup>Now these are the ones sown among thorns; *they are* the ones who hear the word, <sup>19</sup>and the cares of this world, the deceitfulness of riches, and the desires for other things entering in choke the word, and it becomes unfruitful. <sup>20</sup>But these are the ones sown on good ground, those who hear the word, accept *it*, and bear fruit: some thirtyfold, some sixty, and some a hundred.” (NIV)
