SNAP BENEFITS FOR PARENTS WITH SCHOOL AGED CHILDREN

The Pandemic EBT program (P-EBT), a supplemental food purchasing benefit to current SNAP participants and as a new EBT benefit to other eligible households to offset the cost of meals that would have otherwise been consumed at school. **Anyone who has school age children can apply for P-EBT benefits on ABE Illinois website.** Benefits are calculated using a \$5.70 per day and per student calculation.
